- 1) **H.Res. 218** – Congratulating charter schools and their students, parents, teachers, and administrators across the United States for their ongoing contributions to education (*Rep. Porter – Education & the Workforce*)
- 2) **H.Res. 216** – To honor the late playwright Arthur Miller and the University of Michigan for its intention of building a theatre in his name (*Rep. Schwarz – Education & the Workforce*)
- 3) **H.Res. 195** – Recognizing the 60th anniversary of Victory in Europe (VE) Day and the Liberation of Western Bohemia (*Rep. Kingston – International Relations*)
- 4) **H.Res. 233** – Recognizing the 60th anniversary of Victory in Europe (V-E) Day during World War II (*Rep. Gallegly – International Relations*)
