*(157th Calendar Day of the Year – 39th Voting Day of the Year – 53 Voting Days until Target Adjournment)***FLOOR SCHEDULE AND BILL SUMMARY**

[H.R.5441](#) – Department of Homeland Security Appropriations Act for FY07 (*Rep. Rogers {KY} – Appropriations*) (*Complete Consideration - Members who have amendments made in order under the unanimous consent agreement reached last week must be present to offer their amendments*). This bill provides \$33.14 billion for operations and activities of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) in fiscal year 2007. Funding in this bill includes \$6.44 billion for Customs and Border Protection with \$1.27 billion allocated from user fees; \$3.87 billion for Immigration and Customs Enforcement; \$3.62 billion for the Transportation Security Administration; \$8.13 billion for the Coast Guard; \$1.29 billion for the Secret Service; \$3.88 billion for the Preparedness Directorate; \$2.64 billion for FEMA; and \$956 million for science and technology.

Under a unanimous consent agreement entered into on May 25th, only the following amendments may be considered. Each of these amendments is debatable for 10 minutes:

- **Obey Amendment.** Regarding funding levels and tax cuts.
- **Doolittle Amendment.** Regarding funding limitation on expedited removal.
- **Campbell Amendment.** Regarding funding limitation on Section 642(a) of the 1996 Immigration Act.
- **Jackson-Lee Amendment.** Regarding funding limitation on DHS closures in Texas.
- **Jackson-Lee Amendment.** Regarding funding limitation on lawsuits against FEMA.
- **Markey Amendment.** Regarding funding limitation on air cargo security.
- **Filner Amendment.** Regarding funding limitation on USIA grants.
- **Deal Amendment.** Regarding funding limitation on birthright citizenship.
- **Poe Amendment.** Regarding funding limitation on Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative.
- **Kingston Amendment.** Regarding funding limitation on volunteer surveillance on the border.
- **Garrett Amendment.** Regarding funding limitation on adult entertainment, clown and puppet shows, and other activities.
- **Tancredo Amendment.** Regarding funding limitation on diversity visa program.
- **Foxx Amendment.** Regarding funding limitation on Louis Vuitton handbags.
- **Bishop (NY) Amendment.** Regarding funding limitation on reimbursement of attorney fees.
- **Berkley Amendment.** Regarding funding limitation on threat assessments related to certain populations
- **Culberson Amendment.** Regarding funding limitation on CIS benefits and background checks.
- **Kuhl Amendment.** Regarding limousine service and fire protection funding.
- **Rogers (KY) Amendment.** Regarding funding levels.

[H.Res.842](#) - Rule providing for consideration of **[H.R. 5254](#)** – Refinery Permit Process Schedule Act (*Rules*). The Rules Committee has recommended a closed rule that provides one hour of general debate and provides one motion to recommit.
