## TOMORROW'S OUTLOOK

The GOP Leadership has announced the following schedule: on Wednesday, the House will meet at 2:00 p.m. for legislative business and is expected to consider four bills under Suspension of the Rules. The House may also consider Motions to go to Conference and Instruct Conferees on: H.R.2862 – Science, State, Justice & Commerce Appropriations Act for FY 2006 (*Wolf – Appropriations*); H.R.2528 – Military Quality of Life & Veterans Affairs Appropriations Act (*Walsh – Appropriations*); H.R.2863 – Department of Defense Appropriations Act for Fiscal Year 2006 (*Young {FL} – Appropriations*). Tomorrow, votes will be postponed until the official plane with Members attending the Rosa Parks funeral returns to Washington.
